The first "West of England" festival was held at Truro Cricket Club in Cornwall in July 1983. The teams taking part were the Under 14 county sides from Cornwall, Devon, Gloucestershire and Somerset. The first game between Cornwall and Devon proved very exciting, ending in a tie with Cornwall 186 for 9! In the following years inter-county festivals were organised at Taunton School (for Under 12 and Under 14 teams), Plymouth College (for Under 13 teams) and Treliske Preparatory School (for Under 11 and Under 13 teams). Eventually all these festivals moved to King's College at Taunton, helped by the phenomenal work from the then Head Groundsman, Dennis Breakwell. Thousands of young cricketers have played at King's, including many who currently play in the full England team and lots playing First Class cricket. We have even had young players who are now in the national teams for the Barbados, Trinidad, South Africa and the Netherlands. Altogether this summer there will be over 50 teams aged from Under 11 up to Under 15 teams playing this, the greatest of games. I hope you enjoy the cricket and welcome to King's!

# Rules & Regulations

The laws of Cricket will apply with the following exceptions:

1 All players must be of the correct age for that festival at midnight on the 31 August 2023.

2 Each team can consist of up to 12 players. No more than 11 players can bat or be on the field at any time. All players must be nominated in writing before the toss is made. Umpires will supervise the toss which will be made 30-minutes before the scheduled start time. There is no requirement to nominate which 11 players will bat.

3 No fielder may be closer than 8-11 yards (varies per age group) measured from the middle stump, except behind the wicket on the off side. Umpires should not allow the bowler to bowl until sure that the fielders are not too close.

4 The ECB Fast Bowling Directive will be enforced. Under this directive Fast bowlers will be limited to spells as normal.

5 If the batting team elect to declare in the first innings then the team batting second will not get any extra overs and will be awarded full bowling points from the first innings. Each side may bat for up to their allotted number of overs. If a side gets bowled out in less than the allotted overs the un used overs will not be transferred to the side batting second.

6 If the umpires call a ball 'wide', 1 runs will be added to the total and an extra ball will be bowled plus any runs completed off a wide will also count. For example: 1 run completed by the batsmen off a wide will be scored as 2 wides.

7 A front-foot no-ball shall be 1 run to the total + any additional runs scored. The delivery following a "No-ball" will be a free hit for whichever batsman is facing it. If the delivery for the free hit is not a legitimate delivery (e.g a wide or another no ball) then the next delivery will be a free hit. For any free hit, the striker can be dismissed only under the circumstances that apply for a no ball. Field changes are NOT permitted for free hit deliveries, unless the batsmen have changed ends. A 'bouncer' passing above the batter's head in a normal stance will be a no-ball as will a dangerous full toss over waist high. Only a front foot no ball will result in a free hit.

8 Where rain delays the start of a match or play during either of the innings, the length of the innings will be at the discretion of the Festival organisers and the Ground Staff at Kings College, with the over-riding consideration being to get the longest match possible. In a rain reduced innings, the score from the first innings will be reduced accordingly at an average run per over of the first innings.

9 No bowler may bowl more than 20% of the teams overs.

10 There will be two formal breaks for drinks in each innings, where Managers and Coaches will be given the opportunity of discussing the match and game plan with players. It is assumed that players will leave the pitch, finding an area of shade, and that this interval will not last longer than 10-minutes.

The times of these breaks will be finally determined by the umpires, taking into account the start time, re-start time after meal breaks and the state of the match. The umpires should discuss these breaks with both Managers and decide on the appropriate times.

11 The ECB Safety Guidance on the wearing of cricket helmets will apply throughout the Festival.

12 Teams are expected to maintain an over rate of 16 overs per hour. In exceptional circumstances, if this rate is not maintained, the organisers reserve the right to impose a penalty on a points deducted basis.

13 The Festival Championships will be decided on a points basis as listed below:

### **Points**

Win 10 points

Tie 5 points

Batting bonus points Up to 5 points

Bowling bonus points Up to 5 points

Batting and Bowling points will be available throughout both innings + points for Win's and Tied matches.

If a side batting second cannot achieve maximum batting points they will be awarded extra batting points for each 2 wickets they have remaining when they pass the opposition's target, up to a maximum of 5 batting points.

In a rain affected game, if the game is abandoned as a draw. Each side will receive 4 points, together with any bonus points gained. Both teams must have the opportunity to bat for 15 overs to constitute a game.

In the event of a tie on points in the Championship table at the end of the festival, the result of the game between the top teams will determine the result, if the winner is still not found it will be the team who have taken the most wickets over all festival matches declared the winning team.. If this still hasn't resulted in a winner, the trophy will be shared.

# Health & Safety

## **Fire Alarm Sounding/Possible False Alarm**

If you discover a fire or hear the fire alarm, activate the nearest call point and ensure everybody starts to evacuate the building calmly. All persons should immediately make their way to the assembly (muster) point. A roll call must take place and strictly nobody is to re-enter the building.

Each team's managers are responsible for ensuring the safe evacuation of children in their care and for roll call.

Telephone the festival team or King's College Staff (01823 328141) to check the zone and if confirmed to be a false alarm no call to the fire service is necessary. If you cannot check the premises, or a fire is detected, dial 999.

Under no circumstances should the alarm be silenced or reset by anybody other than a King's Staff member.

Supervise persons at the assembly point and anybody listed on roll call not present should be notified to the Fire Officer. Once the alarm has been dealt with, you will be told when it is safe to re-enter the building.

1. King's College, South Road, Taunton, TA1 3LA - from King's College head towards Taunton Town Center (South Road - B3170)
2. Follow the road left out of the site's main entrance (Mansfield Road - B3170)
3. Take left lane keeping left at the traffic lights (Hurdle Way - A38)
4. Continue to follow the A38 towards Wellington and Exeter (Mary Street and Upper High Street - A38)
5. Turn left into Parkfield Road at the traffic lights - signposted to the Hospital
6. Take first right into Manor Road and immediate left into Parkfield Drive
7. Musgrove Park Hospital, Parkfield Drive, Taunton, TA1 5DA (Tel: 01823 333444) is at the end of Parkfield Drive

## **Purpose**

The King's College Taunton Cricket Festivals are committed to providing a safe and enjoyable environment for all children and young people participating in the event. This Child Safeguarding Policy outlines our approach to ensure the safety and well-being of every child or young person (under the age of 18 years) involved in the festival.

This policy applies to all individuals involved in the King's College Taunton Cricket Festivals, including staff, volunteers, participants, and spectators. All staff and volunteers will receive training on child safeguarding as part of their induction process.

Our collective purpose is to protect children and young people from harm and abuse, ensuring that all staff, volunteers, and participants understand their roles and responsibilities in protecting children and young people, creating an environment that fosters trust, respect, and open communication.

## **Responsibilities**

All staff and volunteers involved in the festivals are responsible for the welfare and safety of the children and young people participating in the event.

This includes:

- Treating all children and young people with respect and dignity.
- Following the festival's code of conduct and behaviour guidelines.
- Reporting any concerns about a child's welfare to the designated Child Safeguarding Officer (CSO) who is responsible for overseeing the implementation of this policy.

## **Reporting Procedures**

All concerns about a child's welfare should be reported to the designated CSO immediately.

The CSO will then:

- Assess the situation and determine the appropriate course of action.
- Contact the relevant authorities if necessary, including the police or social services.
- Maintain confidentiality, sharing information only on a need-to-know basis.
